IMPORTANT SYLLABUS REQUIREMENTS CHANGES...

PLEASE NOTE THAT ALL OF THE BELOW ARE MANDATORY...

New from 2020. Solo Recital Examinations.

Over the last few years, the Guild has had a Solo Recital syllabus for Pianoforte only as a separate syllabus to the Full Solo Examination syllabus. This now can be an option for all instruments or vocal.

The Rectal program's format consists of the following.

Technical work. Up to grade 7 only.

List pieces.

Choice of General knowledge OR Program notes. Up to grade 7 only.

Choice of Ear test OR Sight reading. Up to grade 7 only.

Grade 8, C.Mus, A.Mus & L.Mus Recitals are all Performance based.

No scales or subsections required.

Performance notes are required.

No theory prerequisites are required.

Marking and examination times is the same as the Full Solo examinations.

The only variation in the marking is that General knowledge is awarded 10 marks and the choice of Ear test OR sight is awarded 10 marks also.

Other than Pianoforte, the teacher will use the requirements of the standard solo syllabus for all other instruments and vocal.

Assisted Performance Examinations.

At the request of a few teachers, we are introducing Assisted Performance Examinations. These examinations are simply designed for students with additional needs of any age who have been found to be quite competent in their area in performing. However they are students who generally need assistance to progress through an examination from someone who they are familiar with such as the teacher, etc.

These examinations will be based on the performance syllabus from Preparatory though to Level 5 only. Students will have an assistant to help them progress through the examination. It won't be mandatory for the student introduce their pieces themselves. Their assistant can do this for them. A program would be advisable profiling and listing what the student is capable of achieving apart from listing the performance pieces. To enter students for the assisted examinations, the teacher needs to indicate on the entry form as follows. **A-Level ?** followed by what level the student is entering for. The letter "A" will indicate that the student will be assisted. This will be shown on the report as well as the certificate.

The teacher will need to obtain and submit a doctor's certificate for these entries to certify that the student is eligible for entry into these examinations. Diploma Performance memory requirements

The memory component for Associate, Associate Recital and Professional Performance will no longer be compulsory.

Licentiate, Licentiate Recital and Public Performance will be unchanged and a memory piece will still be expected.

Technical Exercises.

Technical exercises are no longer mandatory in examinations if required within the technical work. E.g. Piano, guitar, etc. Obviously singing/vocal exercises will remain, as this is the core part of the technical requirements. Teachers and students are still encouraged to pursue these exercises in the normal technical development as these carefully designed exercises will develop a very secure foundation in finger dexterity.

Please note that vocal students can use their accompanist to play along with the technical exercises during the examination.

Also vocal students can use Vocalizes instead of Concones for their technical exercise. These are common in the VCE or HSC school programs particularly if students are doing year 11 or 12 contemporary music subjects.

Sight Reading / Singing.

Candidates will be allowed a reasonable time to practice their sight reading/singing exercises prior to being asked to perform it. The examiner will provide the sample in which the student can then practice playing or singing. After a short time the examiner will then ask them to perform it from which point they will assess the presentation.

Please note that vocal students can use their accompanist to play through the sight singing exercise prior and during the assessment.

General Knowledge Substitute.

General knowledge oral questions can be substituted with a detailed program presented to the examiner at the start of the examination. The program should consist of a student profile followed by a short but concise detail of each item presented.

This should include the information about the composer, the style, and the general theory elements of the music presented. The examiner will mark on the general impression of the program notes and its content.

Please note that oral general knowledge questions will be based on the list pieces / songs only.

General theory questions will no longer be asked as these elements have already been covered in the theory examination prerequisites needed to complete and certify the Full Solo examination grades.

Accoustic, Digital Pianos & Keyboard Examinations.

Acoustic, digital pianos can be used for any level of examination. Both should be 88 key versions. Keyboard examinations using automated backing etc for the different grades/levels still need to be discerned by the teacher. Also the different playing style formats need to be demonstrated and mixed within the examination. This is also a requirement for Electronic Organ as well.

Own Choice Pieces.

As has been in earlier syllabuses, teachers and students can choose any performance program they wish to present for their examination without approval up to grade/level 7. Proficiency, level 8 and diplomas, must still have approval through the appropriate avenues. Own choice can include the use of any other examination boards published books, or general syllabus list, if the teacher so desires. These pieces should be a good guide to the general standard for the grade/level that is being attempted. Other pieces should be carefully picked and it is up to the teacher that the chosen works is similar in standard to others already listed in the syllabus. All teachers can send copies of pieces to the Guild office for approval if in doubt of the standard or suitability. Of course the higher levels, as mentioned above, must have approval.

The most preferred and quickest way for approval is to scan the pieces and email to Jeff Wood >pianoforte@hotkey.net.au< and the reply email will act as your approval notification.

Examination Streams:

The streams are as follows and are available for all instruments and vocal.

1. Full Solo Examination Programs:

(Recommended if pursuing university music majors)

These grades will cover:

Technical work, Performance, Sight reading, Ear test, General knowledge OR Program Notes.

A theory prerequisite is required for these grades.

2. Recital Solo Examination Programs:

These grades will cover:

Technical work, Performance, Sight reading OR Ear test, General knowledge **OR** Program Notes. No theory prerequisite is required for these levels.

3. Performance Examination Programs:

These levels will cover:

Performance general impression which involves dress code, stage presence, program notes and introductions with conducive information about each item being presented. No theory prerequisite is required for these levels.

Performance pieces in all streams can be a mixture of any style.

Classical only.
 Contemporary only.
 Baroque, Classical, Romantics & 20th century.
 Blues, Jazz, Rock, OR any commercial genre.

3. Any mixture. Classical or Contemporary.

Great care should be maintained that a variety of style is delivered from whatever genre is picked. As mentioned above, any old or new syllabi form any examination board is a good guide and resource for pieces that can be used for your choice in selecting your examination program.

Examination Performance & Recital Upgrades.

This program allows all Performance and Recital examination candidates to upgrade to a full standard grade examination. The candidates will receive credit for all the lists or items that were performed with marks awarded transferred to the examination report. The following details will outline this upgrade procedure.

Please note that these examination upgrades are only available up to Level 8 Performance and Grade 8 Recital.

- 1. Students will submit a separate entry form detailing the grade to be undertaken and outlining the performance or recital examination details that was completed. A copy of the previous report will need to be supplied along with the entry form for verification.
- 2. The candidate will pay 50% of the current fees listed for the level they wish to upgrade. A half examination time will be allowed for each upgrade exam.
- 3. Candidates will be required to bring with them a copy of the previous Performance or Recital examination report for the examiner to calculate and transfer the list / item results and subsections if required.
- **4.** The examination will consist of an extensive technical presentation as well as the subsections that were not covered in the Performance / Recital programs.
- 5. Theory prerequisites will be required as usual to certify these upgrades.

RECITAL Examination Information. Available for all instruments and vocal.

RECITAL EXAMINATIONS do not require any theory pre-requisite. The examination is based on the standard solo examination with technical work along with 3 or 4 pieces as required for the grade level. General knowledge OR Programs notes are a must. However the candidate can choose between Ear Test **OR** Sight Reading. From Grade 8 onwards the examination is based on performance only. Also the candidates are required to submit an explanatory Folio.

PERFROMANCE Examination Information. Available for all instruments and vocal.

PERFORMANCE EXAMINATIONS do not require any theory pre-requisite, Technical work, or Subsections. However candidates are required to submit an explanatory Folio.

Theory on demand details. (TOD) Music & Speech.

- 1. Theory on demand caters for Preliminary up to Grade 8.
- 2. It will be available any time from the start of February to the end of November each year.
- **3.** A separate entry form is available for the candidate's grade details as well as the supervisor information.
- 4. Fees will be as listed for each grade in the contact, plus a \$40 surcharge for each student entry. If two or more students are sitting at the same time and grade with the same supervisor, then the additional same grade papers will only incur a fee of \$10 surcharge each. This surcharge will cover the extra cost of producing the individual papers for the candidate. Also these exams do require extra administration and mail costs that need to be covered.
- Papers will be marked and reports done as soon as the supervisor returns the finished papers. Results should be back within a 2 to 3 week turnaround once they have been returned by the supervisor.

BS = (Beginner's Stage). Stage 1 to 7. **ESC** = (English Speakers Certificate).

Year 7 to 11. Year 12 = (Higher Certificate in Drama Performance).

Syllabus 5. Oral Communication for Small Groups. Examination levels are:

Prep = (Preparatory). **Jun** = (Junior). **Elem** = (Elementary). **Inter** = (Intermediate).

HCOC = (Higher Certificate in Oral Communication).

AdvC = (Advanced Certificate in Oral Communication).

Syllabus 6. (**Spoken Language Development.** Examination levels are:

Year 3 to 9. Year 10 = (Higher Certificate in Spoken Language Development).

Syllabus 7. Choral Speaking. Examination levels are:

Year 2 = (Prep). Year 3 to 9. Year 10 = (Higher Certificate in Choral Speaking).

Syllabus 8. Communication for Public Speaking. Examination levels are:

Level 6 to 7. **ProL8** = (Proficiency - Level 8)

ACPSB = (Associate Communication and Public Speaking for Business).

2. Subject Listing.

List the instrument, including voice that is being presented for your examination. No need to identify whether you are performing **modern**, **classical or a mix of both** as certificates will be issued indicating your instrument or voice only.

Also different styles of guitar such as **Electric**, **Acoustic & Nylon** will be stated as **Guitar** only as many students are performing on a mixture of guitars within the same examination.

Keyboard instruments will be classified:

Acoustic & Digital pianos only need to be listed as – **Piano** Pipe, Theatre, OR Electronic organs only need to be listed as – **Organ** Electronic keyboards will be listed as - **Keyboard.**

3. Entry Forms. PRINT all details.

Use first and surnames only No middle names will be used.

Make sure spelling is correct. Teachers need to check spelling and examination details on the examiners running sheets and contact the office if any errors are found.

Use the current fee list to calculate the total of the entries and summit **ONE** payment for the total of the fees. It is the teacher's responsibility for this examination payment. No multiple student payments will be excepted unless the student is a self entry and no teacher is involved.

Make sure entries are submitted on time. Contact the office if any delay is going to occur. Also let the office know if a candidate was overlooked so arrangements can be made to include them.

Once examinations are programmed it is not possible to change days or venues as examiners have been pre engaged and any change is generally not possible. If some unforseen factor occurs then the teacher must contact the office. Not the examiner.

4. Theory examinations.

Once the theory entries have been received, the GUILD will notify the Supervisor at that particular centre and send the papers direct to them.

5. Video recordings. We may record examinations for examiner training only. These are not released in any way to the public. All level 8, Proficiency & Diplomas must be recorded for verification as 2 examiners are needed for assessment.

6. Certificates Corrections.

If an error is made on the certificate, the correct procedure is to mark on the certificate in **RED PEN**, the correct name, etc and return the certificate to the office either by mail or email and a new one will be issued immediately. However, please remember, if the error is from the entry form, there will be a \$10 fee charged.

7. Fee Refund.

Fees cannot be refunded. When the Guild receives an application for an examination and it is accepted, costs such as postage, phone, office procedures, engaging of examiners are then inevitably incurred by the Guild. Hence the reason for no general refund of fees. But in very exceptional circumstances, (or the inability of the Guild to service the examination Centre), application can be made to the Guild management for consideration of a fee refund.

8. Pre-requisite certification.

It is the teacher's or candidate's responsibility for the necessary application to be made for all Certificates and Diplomas that require a pre-requisite. Just post in the required reports and a return address, with a note "Certificates Please".

Proficiency Certificates, Performance Level 8, Professional, and all Diplomas & Tertiary Qualifications are not issued until the annual Graduation in April or May of each year. They must be applied for in the normal course of events.

PLEASE NOTE: The **Theory Pre-requisite** required, must be a **GUILD** Theory examination. Trinity, AMEB or any other theory result are not generally accepted. However a student can apply for **RPL**. (Recognition of prior learning). The theory exam must have been sat under the same conditions as a Guild examination. No online theory exams will be accepted. Contact the **Guild** office for information.

This also applies where a **Practical Pre-requisites** is required to enter a higher level practical examination. The Guild will generally not accept alternative Grade or Diploma examinations from other examining organisations to satisfy any part of the pre-requisite requirements of any Guild examination.

However irrespective of this regulation, consideration may be given to meet the requirements in all Diploma levels and subjects. The student can apply for **RPL**. (Recognition of prior learning). It is advisable to be finalised your prerequisite prior to making any formal entry into an examination you wish to take. **A non refundable RPL fee will be payable at time of submission.**

10. Queensland Certificate of Education Credits.

Teachers are reminded that many higher **GUILD** examinations in both **MUSIC & SPEECH** are available for study credits for the Queensland Certificate of Education.

The department's requirements are quite stringent, and to apply for these credits, teachers should download the application form from our website. The teacher/student should fill in the form very carefully (as we will not be responsible for correcting any errors), and submit it to us for entry on the QCE database. Forms whose data is rejected by the QSA database will be disposed of without return or query.



These do not require annual replacement as no year is indicated on the certificate. All members can also be listed free of charge on the *Teachers Register* located on the *Guilds web site*.

AIMS. Our chief aim is to support the interests of teachers and students associated with the *GUILD* as well as to assist and promote their work and objectives as an organization together through our annual free *GUILD CONTACT - HANDBOOK* that provides essential information for all teachers and students associated with the organisation. This document is sent to all registered teachers annually via email. A teacher can contact the office for a hard copy if they require one.

ASSOCIATE MEMBERSHIP. (A) Professional use of 'MAGTR' is NOT authorised. Granted to all applicants not qualified as above. After **five years** of successful student Guild examination results, an upgrade to professional membership may be applied for. (An assessment fee applies).

STUDENT (ST) MEMBERSHIP. (ST) Professional use of 'MAGTR' is NOT authorised. For any student enrolled on an approved Guild course.

4. VIDEO ON DEMAND (VOD) EXAMINATIONS. (MUSIC and SPEECH)

Solo Full OR Recital examinations will need a supervisor due to the technical work and sub section requirements. Teachers may assist with the playing of ear test requirements.

Performance examination, on the other hand does not need a supervisor.

The teacher, parent or student, can video the examination as it only involves performance items.

In both instances the video must be recording from the start to the finish without stopping.

Use a separate practical **ENTRY FORM** indicating in the notes section the details of the supervisor etc and send to the **GUILD** office for processing prior to the video examinations taking place. Documentation sheets will be sent out re the recording process along with examination requirements.

'D' Marginal Pass.

No certificate issued at this level. 'D' pass grading is not a fail, but a direction that a repeat of that particular examination is probably necessary before further meaningful progress can be made. This decision, however, rests with the teacher. The 'D' marginal pass category is awarded as an encouragement as it is envisaged that circumstances can sometimes arise that Examiners can easily identify, which could effect a candidate's control over what would normally be a well presented examination.

NGS. Not Grade Standard.

Music Examiners will mark as **NGS** (Not Grade Standard), the technical work, or any List piece, which in the opinion of the Examiner falls within that category of assessment in any particular examination. It is not a fail. The mark simply suggests that there is more work to be completed to bring the work up to the standard expected for that level of examination.

Half Examination Availability for Higher Levels. A half examination may be requested by the examiner. This occurs when a good majority of the examination was competent, but a couple of sections did not quite make the grade or diploma level. The examiner will indicate in the summary section that a half examination is available and they will outline what sections they wish to hear again. A half fee will be payable on re-entry. Submit the report for verification of the offer. Contact the **Guild office** for more clarification. A video exam is possible rather than waiting for the next series of examinations.

Level Eight is the pre-requisite examination for Professional. Professional is the pre-requisite examination for Public Performance.

<u>PLEASE NOTE:</u> Performance Level 6 to P.P, Grade 8 Recital, Cmus Recital, Associate & Licentiate Diplomas. The examiner may choose to mark the overall performance out of 80 rather than 16 for each item. The comments will reflect the overall performance. The concluding summary OR subsections will remain out of 20.

7. EXAMINATION ROOM.

Music & Speech. Only the candidate(s) with the Examiner(s) are allowed in the examination room with the exception of that portion only of the singing or instrumental examination that requires the attendance of an accompanist, additional supporting artist or group. On completion of the task, the accompanist, additional supporting artist or group must then leave the examination room. In all practical examinations the GUILD reserves the right to use Video and/or Audio systems at any time.

8. ABSENT CANDIDATES.

Absent candidates will forfeit the fees paid. The only exceptions to this rule are in the event of a death in the family, illness or accident, school examinations being scheduled for the same date, or for religious purposes. An appropriate certificate or letter should be obtained and a copy attached to any future examination entry at half fee at the next Series. A video examination can be organized to save the student waiting till the next series of examinations. Send in a request letter, the certificate and the required half fee to the **Guild office** and the appropriate paper work will be sent to you.

9. EXAMINATION STUDENT FORMS.

Teachers will be sent student examination forms that need to be filled out with the all the details requested on the form. Print clearly all information including the items being performed. Be careful with spelling. These forms will be handed to each student to take into the examination room and given to the examiner.

10. MUSIC REPEATS.

Candidates must be familiar with the repeats as marked in the examination pieces being played, but unless requested by the Examiner, they need not be performed. However, *Da Capo* should always be observed.

11. PHOTO COPIES & WEB DOWNLOADED MUSIC.

Teachers and students need to be aware that photocopies from books that are still in print can be used in examination. However, the book that the music is copied from must be brought into the examination room. Copies can be used for convenience to avoid page turns. Authorised photocopies can be used provided an official authorisation stamp is printed on the copy, or a receipt can be produced for such copies to be used. Also downloaded music should have the web site listed on it from which it was downloaded for verification if ever required.

Examiners are not photo copy police, but we all need to be aware of the photo copy laws that are in place to protect the print music industry. The Guild does not condone, nor does it want to be seen as a third party in allowing blatant photocopying of music.

12. PENCIL MARKS. (MUSIC)

All references to time, keys, modulations, form, word or sign meanings, or similar teaching aids, must be completely erased from each piece of music before entering the examination room. If this is not done, the scope of General Knowledge questioning is severely limited, and therefore must adversely effect the assessment. However, essential marks relative to performance may remain

13. METRONOME MARKS. (MUSIC)

Be aware that the suggested speeds found on the music may not be relevant to the Grade standard you are taking and should be adjusted when preparing for your Grade level. However an unduly retarded tempo downgrades a List piece automatically. An exaggerated tempo destroys the mood and style of the music. Candidates should be guided by their teacher what is the appropriate tempo. Accuracy should be the aim. Not how fast you can get to the end of the piece.

14. MEMORY PERFORMANCE. (MUSIC and SPEECH)

Other than in Licentiate OR Public Performance examinations, candidates are not required to play and perform instrumental music or to recite examination works from memory. However, all students should be encouraged to do so from a very early Step or Grade level. In the music examination, no specific marks are prescribed for memory playing, but if reliably performed, the Examiner will take this into overall account when assessing the performance. Memory playing in itself will in no way lessen the effects of errors in notation, style, rhythm, phrasing, dynamics or expression. To have value, memory playing must have accuracy and a satisfying musical content otherwise it is much better to keep to the printed copy. No exemption is granted from the requirement for memory requirements in the Licentiate OR Public Performance Diploma examinations.

15. SPECIAL EXAMINATION REQUIREMENTS.

Blind Candidates. It is recommended the blind students go through the Performance or Recital examination streams which both do not require sight reading. If the student has partial sight they may be able to use a enlarged copy of their sight reading pre prepared by the examiner providing the **Guild office** is informed well in advance of the examination day. In the same way the blind candidate can be given an enlarged theory paper and given extra time to complete it.

16. GUILD UPDATES. All syllabi are in the process of a major overall over the next 12 months. We will notify all teachers by email as each of these are finalized and PDFs are available from the **GUILD** office **OR** web site.

BACHELOR OF MUSIC COURSE.

Fully accredited course - Fee Help available.

Students who have completed **Year 12 VCE** (*or equivalent*) with a strong music background and are interested in a career in music or music teaching should consider the **AGME** accredited **Bachelor of Music** course. The **Bachelor of Music** equips musicians to become proactive leaders in their profession. Graduates will be fully prepared for further higher study or a range of employment contexts. **AGME** has the resources, staff expertise and facilities to create dedicated musicians, developing and preparing them for entry into a rewarding and fulfilling lifetime career. Students can be enrolled either as on campus or as distance students, or in a blended mode of both face-to-face and distance learning. All students (*on campus and distance*) use our **Online Learning Platform** to access student information and participate in online teaching and learning activities.

THE COURSE INCLUDES:
